LARGE GAIN

Shown In Covington

In Occupational License Fee Collection For 1930 Despite Depression
—Increase \$42,000.

Despite business depression and discontinuance of collection of certain occupational licenses, a substantial gain was made in the amount of occupational licenses collected during 1930 over 1929, according to William E. Longstreet, Covington License Inspector.

Longstreet, who is preparing his annual report in detail, yesterday asserted that approximately \$106,000 was collected in occupational licenses in 1930, in comparison with \$102,758 in 1929. "There will be a net gain of approximately \$42,000 when all figures have been tabulated," Longstreet asserted yesterday.

Longstreet called attention to the fact that at the beginning of 1930 the city discontinued collection of license fees from keepers of rooming houses, chauffeurs and several other branches. "The city loses about \$3,500 in market rentals alone and with other branches the total loss will be approximately \$6,200 from these sources," Longstreet said.

"We also have been confronted by loss of revenue on account of business depression," Longstreet said. "Many persons who formerly were in business refused to pay licenses this year, asserting that they were quitting business. This cuts down the amount collected by the city. However, I am pleased to show that a substantial gain has been made in the total collections."

Longstreet yesterday called attention to the fact that license of the Latonia race track for the last fall meeting was as yet unpaid and would have added to the total amount collected.

"Under normal conditions there should have been between \$15,000 and \$20,000 more than was collected during the year," Longstreet said.

A Good Record

TAX collectors sometimes are unpopular individuals, but the public should appreciate the record of William Longstreet, Covington license inspector, whose collections for 1931 totaled \$118,886, an increase of nearly \$12,000 over the preceding year.

This annual report, for a year marked by unusual business depression, shows definitely the difference between efficiency and inefficiency in government. Because of business conditions, with resultant slashing and abolishing of fees, Longstreet's diligence in collecting the taxes justly due the city is especially praiseworthy.

If occupational taxes are collected at all, they should be collected fairly, every business or profession paying its just due. Longstreet has shown himself competent in getting for the city the money due it under the occupational tax statute.

Comparison of Longstreet's record with the record of former license tax collection shows the old system up to great disadvantage. It recalls that an investigation of the license department after Charter government was installed in Covington resulted in indictment of four former officials.

It also recalls that no trial ever has been held to determine whether the officials accused were guilty as charged.

From one of the most inefficient departments of the city, Longstreet has made the license department one of the most efficient.



Covington Citizens do you know that should you neglect your gas or electric bill the utilities would disconnect the service and no excuse save paying the bill with penalty added would restore their service to you? And this procedure would be carried out regardless of any weather condition-sickness or death or any misfortune you may have had befall you.

As in the theatrical profession it is known that regardless of what happened "The show must go on" so with the utilities it is the same only with this difference "The profits must go on". When you speak of profit on your year's labor you are elated to have saved sufficient of your earnings to be able to pay your taxes. When the utilities say profit they are speaking as a rule of 500 to 1000% - often more on actual expense of production costs. So you can't blame them for watching the pennies lest any should get away.

Now my purpose in calling this matter to your attention is as follows-you, and each person living in Kenton Co., will you please try and think while you read and see who is to blame for the brazen methods used by these thieving roobers who are at the steering wheel of the utilities. How do these vultures get the advantage of us? I would like to ask you - were you ever approached by any agent or attorney representing any large utility as to what kind of a car you would like to have as a present or if you would accept a block of stock gratis in the U. G. & E. CO? Or how would you like to buy a good farm of about 160 acres located just outside the city, well we'll say for about 50¢. Or were you ever invited to meet Mr. Slink at the Gibson for dinner and have some such a proposition just casually broached to you? Certainly you were not. But did you ever imagine that there are men who have had such a experience?

Well, why were they chosen for this occasion to accept a machine or a farm instead of you? Why he had something to sell that you did not possess. Yet you put him in possession of the thing he had to sell so eagerly desired by Mr. Slink. What was it, you ask? Why - POWER - a vote. This man may have possessed the deciding vote on a certain ordinance and if this ordinance is passed by the city council or commissioners as the case may be it would net the utilities which Mr. Slink represents perhaps millions. The next thought I want to emphasize and get this please, all of you, of the millions this utility will profit by this one man's vote, who pays it eventually? You and others such as you. Regardless of how long you live you will continue to pay it.

You may have noticed that our courts here recently have decided that tax payers must stick to their contract. Utilities however may make or break law or contract. They do the same thing to lawyers and judges for that matter. Under such circumstances does it not appear to you that before you cast your vote for any candidate in any election for any office it is to your and your children's interests to earnestly investigate every man or woman who asks for your support as to his or her past record. For they are asking you for more than simply an "X" opposite their names on the ballot. They are asking you to give them something that is really sacred - a thing that has ruined more men than anything else in the line of privilege.

Have you no more judgement or common sense than to consider this duty of voting as a joke? You would have to consider for a long time before you could imagine a more serious duty being assigned to you. Let me illustrate one case that might impress you.

The 1928 records at the court house show the following men were in office. Tom Donnelly-Mayor, with the following commissioners-Mr. Megerle, Mr. Kinsley, Mr. Kleumper, and Mr. Blackburn. This group all voted yes on a contract covering a period of twenty years with the U.G. & E CO., who Mr. Galvin represents to furnish water to them at 10¢. This water the U.G. & E. furnishes Ft. Thomas at 15¢. We also agree in this contract that in case of anything occurring to prevent the U.G. & E from pumping the water to the consumers at Ft. Thomas, we agree to pump the water for them at no additional cost and we pay for the current we buy from the U.G. & E Co. to do this. I might say that while this contract runs for twenty years, the U.G.&E. has notified the people at Ft. Thomas that they will raise the price on the water even though they've got 15 more years for this contract to run and the water is already bought at 10¢. Now we, the citizens of Covington, boast of owning the water works. Do you know what we pay? We pay 18¢. Sounds sensible, doesn't it?

This is only one case that I am calling to your attention. If you think of this when you pay your water rent dont forget it when you go to vote. Some of these men that were on this board are more apt to ask you for your support in the coming election. See if you'll have backbone enough to tell them about this if they do!

Dear Madam:

During the last forty years on several different occasions I have had my mind made up that had you given me an opportunity face to face, and especially in the presence of Joe, I would start at the beginning and if you had stayed to heard me out, to tell you in plain words right to your face exactly what I have always thought of you.

One of the main reasons I have not done it and, this is as true as I am breathing, is that I doubt if I were looking at you and attempting to tell you this I would become so infernal mad that I never would be able to think of words strong enough to convey to you my absolute disgust for you. So I take this method of writing. I can better control myself and I hope that I may be able to get you to understand that as mean as I try to make you think my opinion of you is, I realize that I fall far from the point and that you are far worse than I can paint you.

I want to go back to what I might call the beginning or my first impressions of you. Many years ago, in fact, when I was boarding with you and working at the Ammonia Works you told Joe one of the most contemptible, dirty, low, 100% lies concerning me that I ever heard tell of any woman telling her own husband about his brother. To this day Joe has never mentioned this to me or I to him nor does he know that I know you told him.

However, I want you to know that I would never forgive you on earth for such a contemptible, damnable lie as this was and you know better than anyone else what an infernal lie it was. Not one atom of truth in the entire story. Now I want you to know my true opinion of you. I have in my time met and become acquainted with thousands and thousands of men and women - you are positively the most outlandish liar I have ever met. As a hypocrite, I never saw anybody in my life that was within a mile of you. In fact, about the best thing I know about you is - you are such a hypocrite that you ought never deceive any person of even half intelligence.

Even after writing you this - knowing you as I do - you've got sufficient crust to speak to me even come to see me - but I serve this notice on you here and now - if I never see you again it will be soon enough and if you ever speak to me again you'll regret it.

Longstreet Keeps License Receipts up in Tough Year

Despite the depression, Covington's license receipts for 1931 exceeded those of 1930 and exceeded figures budgeted, according to a report filed by William Longstreet, license inspector, with City Manager Palmore Wednesday.

Longstreet reported collections of \$118,886.72. The budget of City Manager Kratz last year anticipated \$118,000.

Insurance licenses totaled \$14,659, of which \$9000 was collected by Clinton Gardiner, employed by Kratz as a special collector at 50 per cent commission.

General business licenses piled up

\$103,211.72 for the city. Engineers paid \$276, street market stands \$630. Transfer of licenses brought fees of \$110.

In 1930 the license receipts totaled \$107,061.29. In 1929, the last year of "prosperity" and before the city manager regime came in, collections were only \$102,000.

Longstreet pointed out that the increase was made in spite of license reductions in 1931. Private garages and soft drink and soda fountains were lopped off the list. Lawyers and physicians' licenses were cut 40 per cent, theaters and real estate offices 50 per cent, and junk dealers 60 per cent.

Longstreet Answers Meyer's Scale Test Charge.

PALMORE QUIZZED

Swindler Studies Records to Refute Manager.

Two controversies developed in Covington officialdom, Wednesday, which promised to disturb the serenity of the administration.

William Longstreet, license inspector, took sharp issue with Commissioner Louis Meyer over the latter's statement that "no scales have been tested during the past two years."

Commissioner T. Monroe Swindler took equally sharp issue with City Manager H. D. Palmore over the latter's statement that "the three workmen employed on the water main project in West Covington are being paid 40 cents an hour, ten cents more than the relief committee rate."

"There is not a word of truth in Meyer's statement," Longstreet said bluntly. "I have tested hundreds of scales during the past years. Many of them I have destroyed because they were inaccurate. Some of them were in Meyer's markethouse at Seventh street and Scott boulevard. If Meyer would look about and investigate he would learn that nearly every scale in the city has been tested—lots of them several times."

Although the city license inspector is entitled to charge merchants for testing their scales, Longstreet states he has not followed this practice. He said some offered to pay, but he refused the money. Furthermore, he pointed out, previous license inspectors have not been in the practice of receiving pay for this work.

Longstreet said he had paid close attention to this phase of his duties and he resented aspersions cast upon him by Commissioner Meyer. He pointed out that he had different persons in Police Court for using bad scales on several occasions. He was most vigorous in denouncing Meyer's statement.

Manager Declines to Supply Reason for "Firing" Longstreet

"No Reason to Reiterate," He Tells Former Employe.

"WILL SAY PLENTY,"

Discharged Inspector Retorts to Mayor's Remarks.

City Manager H. D. Palmore declined to make a public statement regarding the reason he "fired" William Longstreet, Covington license inspector, after being asked to do so at a meeting of the City Commission, Thursday.

"I have already told you and made a statement to the press and I see no reason to reiterate," the city manager said.

Longstreet prefaced his remarks to the commission and Palmore by saying that "since there is a hazy feeling in the minds of many citizens as to why I was discharged, I would like for you, Mr. Palmore, for it concerns only you, to state publicly just why I was discharged?"

Palmore then made the above reply.

"Did you not say," Longstreet asked, "that you hated to fire me but you had to do it?"

"I don't recall," the manager answered.

"Oh, you don't recall," Longstreet said. "Well, then, did you ask me to resign?"

"Yes, sir," was the answer.

Commissioner Fred Macke interposed to ask "is someone on trial here?" He was not answered.

"We are not here to answer questions, we are here to conduct the business of the city," Mayor Pieper said.

"All right," Longstreet continued. "But the people of Covington paid my salary and they ought to know what kind of a servant I made them. Now I am going to challenge you to scrutinize my two years' work and see if you can find a single act of mine that conflicts with the oath of office that I took. Will you issue the same challenge to me to scrutinize your acts?"

The Longstreet Rumors

THE rumors that William Longstreet, Covington license inspector, is to be discharged, should be denied by the city administration, or, if they contemplate firing him, the commissioners should give good reasons why.

And if their reason is that some politician wants the job, then their reason is not good enough. This was to be a city government free from political favoritism.

H. D. Palmore, the city manager, asked about the rumor, said someone "has been talking ahead of time." This enigma may be explained later.

If there is something against Longstreet which merits his dismissal, it is not apparent in his official record. Appointed to office during the temporary city manager setup, he found the License Department a sorry mess. It was in such condition that the grand jury made an investigation and indicted former officials.

Longstreet considered it his duty to collect license fees. This he did energetically and without favoritism. So efficient was his collecting that his department showed an increase at the end of 1931 over the previous year, one of the few departments of the city to show an increase.

License collecting is a thankless job, since everyone would far rather not pay a license to carry on his business or profession. But since the city has decided to levy taxes on business and occupations, the only fair thing is to collect uniformly, with no favoritism.

That is the way Longstreet has done. The task of license collecting is no job for the back slapper and the good fellow. It takes firmness and fairness.

Longstreet has done a hard job well. If the city is to continue collecting license taxes, there seems to be no cause for discharging Longstreet, unless Palmore has discovered some good reason not apparent in his record. If that is the case, the reasons should be made known or the rumors of Longstreet's impending discharge denied.
